KAINE, DEEDS, 4 HOUSE PRIMARY CANDIDATES RECEIVE CONSERVATION ENDORSEMENT

Richmond, VA The Virginia League of Conservation Voters, the nonpartisan political arm of Virginia's conservation community, today announced its endorsement for Governor, Attorney General and four candidates in the primary contests for the House of Delegates.

VALCV Endorsed Candidates

Tim Kaine – Governor
Creigh Deeds – Attorney General
Joe May (Leesburg) – 33rd House District
David Toscano (Charlottesville) – 57th House District
Jennifer McClellan (Richmond) – 71st House District
Peter Schmidt (Virginia Beach) – 82nd House District

This announcement follows as a result of VALCV's rigorous and non-partisan endorsement process. All gubernatorial and attorney general candidates and all primary candidates in the 33rd, 57th, 71st, and 82nd districts were invited to participate equally in the endorsement process, which includes the review of a candidate's public record, responses to a written questionnaire, participation in a personal interview, and evidence of campaign viability. Lisa Guthrie, Executive Director of the VALCV, stated, "These candidates have provided thoughtful responses and demonstrate a wholehearted commitment to conservation in the commonwealth." In contrast, some of the opponents of the endorsed candidates did not respond to the questionnaire and have refused to go on record regarding critical environmental protection issues. (Candidates for the Lieutenant Governor's race and House candidates for the general election will be considered later in the summer.)

Growth issues like sprawl, traffic and environmental losses continue to be ranked by citizens as the primary reasons for the decline of the quality of life in Virginia. If Virginia continues to grow at the current rate, more land will be developed in the next 40 years than was developed in the previous 400 years¹. Virginians consider their environment a state treasure and have indicated that they will vote for candidates who will seek solutions for these concerns. Virginia's economic future depends on the healthy state of our natural resources and the preservation of our historic and natural monuments. John Jaske, VALCV Board Chairman, remarked, "Virginians deserve elected officials who are eager to demonstrate leadership that ensures a clean and healthy environment for future generations. These endorsed candidates will provide conservation leadership for Virginia."
